If we want the forgiveness of our _____, we ought to do the same thing the people did at Pentecost. Having heard of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we should believe, repent, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of our sins. When we realize that we've sinned, and the burden of sin is on our souls, we ought to repent and be baptized. No "ifs," "ands," or "buts" about it. No substituting what we'd like to do for what God asks us to do. Obedience is doing God's will in God's way. Let's say with our hearts and lives, "yes, Lord! We'll come to you and serve you by obeying what You have taught us to do."

Repentance is the turning away from sin and turning to the way of the Lord. Baptism is an immersion in water for the forgiveness of sin. Saying no to God or changing the instructions would be the worst thing that we could do, and saying yes and obeying them is the best thing that we can do. Let's say yes to God, and God will keep His promise. He'll wash away our sins, He'll add us to the church, He'll give us newness of life.

Let's also say yes to assembling for worship with the church, yes to supporting the church, and yes to serving and teaching others. The Bible says, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your toil is not in vain in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 15:58).
