If you wish to please God, you must know Him and Him. God expects us to do His
I hope and pray you make it your each day to live pleasing to the Lord. It's amazing how many take the grace of God for granted and never think about improving their lives. The apostle Paul said, "So whether we're at home or away, we make it our to please him. For we must all before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil" (2 Corinthians 5:9-10).
When you love the Lord, you want to please Him. You don't act out of or because you feel compelled; you act out of love and respect. David said, "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your, O LORD, my rock and my Redeemer" (Psalm 19:14). His loving and grateful relationship with God led him to take God's desires and His will seriously rather than to suggest that God ought to be happy with whatever we do. God is God, and we're His creatures and His servants. The Lord Jesus said we should first His kingdom and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33).
Our reading today comes from Paul's words in 1 Corinthians, chapter 9:24-27.
I hope none of you are disqualified either, so that we can please the Lord and live with Him forever.
"For the ways of a man are before the of the LORD, He watches all his paths" (Proverbs 5:21). God knows about each of us. He knows how we and how we think. He can look into our and know our intentions. The seer Hanani told Asa the king of Judah, "For the eyes of the LORD move to and fro throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose heart is completely His" (2 Chronicles 16:9). It matters to God whether we're devoted to Him and willing to Him.
The Lord Jesus told two parables about the of heaven. The wise were for the coming of the bridegroom, while the foolish were unprepared. The wise virgins entered into the wedding feast, while the five foolish virgins were not allowed. In fact the Lord said to them, "Truly I say to you, I do not you." (Matthew 25:12). We must be on the then, because we don't know the day nor the hour when the Lord will come a second time.
In the second parable, the Lord Jesus tells of a man about to go on a journey, who called his own and entrusted his possessions to them. He gave five talents to one, two talents to another, and one talent to a third servant. A talent was and worth fifteen years of a laborer's wages. The man with five talents gained five more, and the man with two talents gained two more; but the man with one talent dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

When the master returned from his journey, he the five-talent and the two-talent men. He said, "Well done, good and slave. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the of your master." Wouldn't it be wonderful on the Day of
Judgment to these words from the lips of the Lord Jesus?
The one-talent man said, 'Master, I knew you to be a man, reaping where you didn't sow and gathering where you scattered no seed. And I was afraid, and I went away and your talent in the ground. See, you have what is yours.' But his master answered and said to him, 'You wicked, slave, you knew that I reap where I didn't sow and gather where I scattered no seed. Then you ought to have put my money in the bank, and on my arrival I would have received my money with interest. Therefore take away the talent from him, and give it to the one who has the ten talents. For to everyone who has, more shall be given, and he will have an abundance; but from the one who doesn't have, even what he does have shall be taken away. Throw out the worthless slave into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Matthew 25:24-31).
At this point, the Lord tells us a little more specifically about what will on Judgment Day at the second coming. All the nations will be gathered before Him as He sits on His glorious He will the sheep from the goats. The King will say to the sheep on His right, "Come, you who are blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave Me something to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave Me something to drink; I was a stranger, and you invited Me in; naked, and you clothed Me; I was sick, and you visited Me; I was in prison, and you came to Me." Because they their fellow man, they were honoring the Lord Jesus and serving Him.
To the goats on His left who failed to serve their fellow man, the King will say, "Depart from Me, accursed ones, into the eternal which has been prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry, and you gave Me nothing to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave Me nothing to drink; I was a stranger, and you didn't invite Me in; naked, and you didn't clothe Me; sick, and in prison, and you didn't visit Me." The goats "will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life" (Matthew 25:31-46).
Our culture has this notion that everyone will be no matter how we've acted or treated our fellow man; but not everyone will enter heaven. The Lord Jesus said, "Enter through the gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are who enter through it. For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life, and there are who find it" (Matthew 7:13-14). The Lord has no for anyone to be lost, but people who choose to live in sin and choose to forsake the ways of God also choose to separate themselves from Him.
Paul and Barnabas spoke boldly to the Jews in Pisidian Antioch, and these people Jesus as the Christ. In Acts 13:46, the Bible says "It was necessary that the of God be spoken to you [that is, to the Jews] first; since you repudiate it and you judge yourselves unworthy of life, behold we're turning to the Gentiles." Yes, people have freewill and make up their own about whether they will believe. People also choose whether they would rather keep sin in their lives or People choose whether they will others with kindness or live in anger and hatred. God has shown us the way to eternal life in Jesus Christ, but many choose their ways. By doing so, they judge themselves unworthy of eternal life.
If we wish to please the Father we must in Him and in His promises. Hebrews 11:6 says, "And without it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is

and that He is a rewarder of those who Him." The Lord has blessed us richly, and He's blessed those who call themselves Christians with the knowledge of His will found in the scriptures, and these also include His promises, so that by His teaching and promises we may become partakers of the divine nature and escape the corruption that is in the by lust. This is a great blessing to be treasured and never taken for granted. The Lord expects us to ourselves to becoming His people and following His will.
Second Peter 1:5-11 says, "For this very reason, make every to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. For whoever lacks these qualities is so nearsighted that he is, having forgotten that he was cleansed from his former sins. Therefore, brothers, be all the more diligent to your calling and election, for if you practice these qualities you will never fall. For in this way there will be richly provided for you an inheritance, an entrance into the kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."
The Lord Jesus is our example in all things, yet He realized His was to do the will of the Father. When the disciples wondered why Jesus didn't eat the food they brought to Him as He sat by the well near Sychar, Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the of Him who sent Me, and to accomplish His work" (John 4:34). On another occasion, the Lord Jesus said, "I can do nothing on My As I hear, I judge; and My judgment is righteous, because I do not seek My own will but the will of Him who Me" (John 5:30).
The Lord Jesus knew the day would come when He would die for the of the world. Many doubted Jesus during His earthly ministry, but Jesus knew He had come to earth and that He was indeed the Son of God and the Messiah. The Lord Jesus said, "When you lift up the Son of Man [that is, when I'm crucified], then you will that I am He [that is, the Son of God, the Messiah], and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father Me. And He who sent Me is with Me; He has not left Me alone, for I always do the things that are to Him" (John 8:28-29). At the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus determined to do the will of the Father and not His own will, even at the of His life on a cruel cross.
The Lord Jesus said in Hebrews 10:9 in fulfillment of the prophecy of His sacrifice found in Psalm 40:7-8, "Behold I have to do Your will." If the Lord Jesus felt the necessity of pleasing His Father in heaven, and if we follow His, shouldn't we do everything in our power to please the Father. The Lord Jesus said, "If you keep My commandments, you will in My love; just as I have kept My Father's commandments and remain in His love" (John 15:10). I want to remain in the love of the Father, and I want to remain in the love of the Son!
The apostle Paul by inspiration also encourages us to the Lord by our attitudes, our words, our deeds, and by how we treat others. Romans 12:1-2 says, "Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." We are to live out the will of God in our lives and not be conformed to the ways of the world.

live with the Lord forever. We don't want to be disqualified by to discipline our lives, to

Colossians 1:10 urges us to "walk in a manner of the Lord" and "to please Him in all respects." Whatever God desires should be heart's desire. We should love the things that God loves and stay of the things that God is offended by. Paul urged the young man Timothy, "Now from youthful lusts and righteousness, faith, love and peace, with those who call on
the Lord from a pure heart" (2 Timothy 2:22). Let's keep our hearts pure and serve the Lord with all our
hearts and all our soul.
Matthew 17:1-5 says, "Six days later Jesus took with Him Peter and James and John his brother, and them up on a high mountain by themselves. And He was transfigured before them; and His face shone like the sun, and His garments became as white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, with Him. Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it's good for us to be here; if You wish, I'll make three tabernacles here, one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' And while he was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said, 'This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; to Him!'"
