Scriptures for God's will. The word of God opens a so that we can see ourselves as we truly
are. It warns us of dangers, gives us promises, rebukes our weaknesses, and strengthens our
The inspired word of God is profitable for, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in
righteousness. It gives us everything we need to know spiritually how to live lives and how to
have eternal life.
In the book of Revelation, the Lord Jesus addresses the churches of Asia. Some of these congregations were holding and doing well, while others were in spiritual danger. Some of these congregations had in the same assembly people who held fast to the Lord worshiping with others who were deep in Some were facing persecution, while others were challenged by evil or indifference. This sounds similar to churches in our day. Some are healthy, some are dead, some are holding to the truth, and some are in great error.
The Lord speaks to these seven churches with He is indeed Lord, and every
is accountable to Him. When churches fail to Him, He calls them to wake up and remember,
remember what the Lord did for them on the cross and how He saved them. Some churches simply need

Our reading today comes from the book of Revelation 2:1-6.
Let's pray. "O, Father help us to love You, to serve You, and to stay close to You, and to live with You always in love and in service. In Jesus' name, Amen."

Unlike Ephesus, their works exceeded their first. But the Lord had much against them, because they Jezebel, who called herself a prophetess. To hear some speak today, there's no such thing as sexual immorality; but the Lord demands that we live lives.

To each of the seven churches of Asia, the Lord Jesus said, "The one who has an ear, let him what the Spirit says to the churches." Listening to what the Spirit says in the word of God is still just as important as it was in the first century. The Spirit didn't speak these words to the people of the world, but to people who were of the Lord's church. They knew about the grace and love of the cross; and they knew of the second coming and Judgment Day. They needed, however, that the Lord knew what was going on in their lives.
The words "wake up" appear twice in this chapter, "remember" appears twice, "faithful" appears three times, "hold fast" appears three times, and "repent" appears eight times. The Lord Jesus was trying to get the churches to wake up, to remember, to repent, to be faithful and to hold fast to Him. What the Lord Jesus said to these seven churches is just what we too to hear as well. As a Christian, you may need to repent, confess your sins, and pray to God to forgive you. First John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."
By "Christian," I mean one who has obeyed the gospel according to the teaching of the Scripture. To obey the gospel, believe in Jesus Christ as the Son of God, repent of evil and turn to the Lord, confess Jesus as the Christ, and be baptized into Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Baptism into Christ is an immersion in water in the name of Jesus Christ. When you're baptized, God washes away your sins and gives you newness of life (Roman 6:3-7, and Acts 22:16).
