The Hebrews writer said, "without the shedding of blood there is forgiveness of sins" (Hebrews 9:22). Jesus couldn't bring about our forgiveness way than shedding His blood on the cross (John 10:18). Jesus out of love took the initiative to die for our sins so that we could be forgiven and live a and different life.
The forgiveness of God implies something; it implies that we are God to forgive us. Do you to be forgiven? No matter how ugly, how terrible, or how mean you may of yourself or to yourself that you are such a sinner that God could never forgive you, sinners are the only kind of people that God saves, and God still loves you. Jesus told a meaningful parable in Luke 18:9-14. No matter how you've wondered away, God will let you come home, if you will humble your heart and you're willing to be
When Jonah preached to that ungodly city Nineveh, they; and God relented. God does have a criteria for those whom he – repentance and confession. David said, "The sacrifices of God are a broken; a broken and contrite, O God, you will not despise" (Psalm 51:17). Can you think of anything more arrogant than to say to the Savior who died for us that we don't saving?

"whatever" generation, because people will nearly anything. Is this? We love
the, because it reveals God's eternal, unchangeable teaching. God's Word is
fickle. Since God's Word doesn't, we can count on His to remain true.
When God promises to forgive, we can be forgiven. When God promises the obedient a
in heaven, we can freely to be obedient and enjoy that promise.
The U.S. Military Academy at West Point has a simple but rigorous code. It simply
says, "A Cadet will not lie, cheat, or steal, nor those who do." Honesty and
integrity have always been to our nation's military. Sometimes gullible and
sometimes deceptive, Americans today seem all too ready to whatever they like,
whether it's true or not. Many have lost their ability to between what is true and
what is not, between what is right and what is wrong. Many believe "whatever" is at
the time and they are undisturbed when "whatever" is false or harmful.
In a pluralistic society, where people feel pressured to believe that is okay, many
believe that all religions are the same and they end up believing in nothing with any
Many have ceased to for the truth or to it. If belief is
true, then belief can be counted on. If every belief is true, then nothing is
Nothing matters. People who say that religions are okay are actually confused and
deceived. People often say that we cannot say any doctrine is, but is this true? What
has happened to the truth and being to the Lord Jesus?
Read what Paul wrote to the church in Colossae in Colossians 2:1-8.
Colossae was a town in the Lycus River Valley on the main route from Ephesus to the
Euphrates. Other nearby cities were larger and more important. Colossae had much of
its importance. Romans and Greeks and transplanted Jews lived there, and the frequent visitors
made it a place that was susceptible to every idea that came along. The inspired apostle
Paul wrote the Colossian letter to deal with a doctrine arising among some members
of the church. He wrote to them of the false teaching and the deception that was in
worldly philosophy. A smooth talking stranger can easily a naïve person with false
promises and worldly traditions that sound Paul them not to be fooled by

Learning to distinguish what is true from what is false is one of the most important

He bound him and put him in prison of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip.
For John had been saying to him, "It is not for you to have her" (Matthew 14:4).
Herod was grieved about the matter, (that is, John being put in prison) but Herodias
to have John beheaded. An evil person who hasin his or her heart has no
compassion. They will take vengeance into their own

Selfish desire also people to commit murder. People who are for power and gold will do anything to eliminate their competition. The Bible says, "When Jehoram had ascended to the throne of his father and was established, he killed all his brothers with the sword, and also some of the princes of Israel" (2 Chronicles 21:4). His lust for caused him to do horrible things; he did it even to his own family. James 3:16 says, "For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice."
Sexual can also lead to much evil. When David lustfully committed adultery with Bathsheba and got her pregnant, it to many other sins. He tried to it up by getting Bathsheba's husband Uriah to come home to her. When nothing else worked, David arranged for Uriah to in battle. Nathan the prophet rebuked David (2 Samuel 12:9). Remember, when we sin against , we're sinning also against Himself. If we God, we will not allow selfishness to dominate our lives.
The apostle Paul listed a number of fleshly in Galatians 5; and each of them arises out of this selfishness. When people against God and must have their own way, they lose sight of everyone else.
