Paul told the Jews in the synagogue of Antioch of Pisidia, "Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man (speaking of Jesus) forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by Him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses" (Acts 13:38-39).
Ephesians 2:8 says we are "saved by grace through faith," but some have assumed it says Some say we are saved by faith The word "alone," however, isn't in this passage. Words like "grace" and "faith" are much and in meaning than some think. The grace of God does far than merely save us from sin. Every blessing, every talent, and every opportunity we enjoy by the grace of God. The apostle Paul recognized that God's grace affected aspect of his life. Read what Paul spoke of God in 2 Timothy 1:9-11. God's grace and purpose touch of our lives as Christians as well.
In the same way, faith is more than merely believing. It's more than mentally agreeing that something is Faith is a package word that encompasses aspect of our commitment to Jesus Christ. Read James 2:20-24. Faith must demonstrate itself in order to God.
To believe means you are to deny yourself, take up your cross daily, and follow the Lord. The Lord Jesus said, "He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me;

and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me" (Matthew 10:37-38). The Lord expects us to give ourselves to Him; it takes more than mere faith. Our faith must demonstrate itself in a of commitment. Jesus told the saints in Smyrna, "Be faithful until, and I will give you the of life" (Revelation 2:10). Believing means remaining to the very end, through every challenge.
The Lord knows our by how we live. God said, "I the LORD search the heart and I test the mind, to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his deeds" (Jeremiah 17:10). If we serve the Lord, He will us; but if we fail to put our faith into practice, we'll face His John 3:36 says, "Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him." We to God and to the world what is in our hearts by our behavior.
We must never imagine that our behavior doesn't We should never ourselves by thinking we can in rebellion to the will of God and still peace and be saved. Galatians 6:7-8 says, "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one, that will he also For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life." The reason it says "Do not be deceived" is because people tend to delude themselves that they can live as they and won't face judgment. It is an undeniable: we reap what we've sown. You cannot God by thinking a life of sin will bring you eternal life. Planting wheat will not produce corn, and living in sin will not produce righteousness.
One day we will all a day of judgment. "For we must all before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has in the body, whether good or evil" (2 Corinthians 5:10). If we are right with God and have lived for Him, we will be; and if we have lived in sin and rejected Jesus, we will be recompensed for that, too. Our behavior matters. <b>Read Revelation 20:11-12 about this scene</b> .
Everyone from every age and every continent will be on that day. Some will wish they could judgment, but they have no place to go. They will be judged, every one of them, by the things in the books. What books? The Lord Jesus said, "The one who rejects me and does not receive my words has a judge; the word that I have spoken will judge him on the last day" (John 12:48). Romans 6:17-18 says, "But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness." What standard or pattern is that? Romans 6:4-7 tells us: "We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might in newness of life. For if we become united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His. We know that our self was crucified with Him (that is, in baptism) in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin.
