book for everyone, in every stage of life, and in every circumstance. Whatever struggle or heartache you face, God has some and help for you. He hasn't forgotten or abandoned you. This man was utterly alone and buried by strangers.

Jesus and indeed one of a kind! We can thank God that He came to this and gave Himself that we might have forgiveness, that we might have eternal life, and hope. Because of Jesus, we have reconciliation with the Father. Because we in His name, the Father hears and answers. Because of Jesus, we can become of God and fellow heirs with Christ in heaven. How is Jesus able to do all this?
First, Jesus is unique because He has existed. Read John 1:1-3 . Some see Jesus as nothing more than a; others see Him only as a traveling preacher. The Bible, however, teaches that Jesus was in the beginning and you and me. In Revelation 22:13 Jesus said, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the and the, the beginning and the end." The Lord Jesus told the Jews, "Truly, truly, I say to you, Abraham was, I am" (John 8:58). In saying this, Jesus revealed His divine, that He's always existed.
Second, Jesus is unique in that He prophecies made hundreds of years before His birth. You cannot find prophecies of other religious like those that are made about Christ. The apostles appealed repeatedly to God's prophecies found in the Old Testament to show Jesus is the prophet and the Messiah. J. Barton Payne listed Old Testament prophecies about Jesus. Alfred Edersheim, a Jewish Christian scholar, cited Old Testament passages referring to the Messiah. The Jews that a Messiah would come, and Jesus fulfilled those well-known prophecies precisely as no one else could.
The prophets knew that Jesus would be a son of David, that He would be in Bethlehem of Judea, that He would be betrayed by a for thirty pieces of silver, that He would be crucified, that His would not be broken, that soldiers would over His clothes, and that darkness would cover the land. The prophets knew that He would triumphantly into Jerusalem on a donkey, that He would in parables, and that He would from the dead on the third day. Isaiah, the prophet, knew that He would make His grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death.
The Lord Jesus could say, "these are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled" (Luke 24:44). Jesus said the prophets about Him in John 5:39. Peter could claim, "the things which God announced beforehand by the mouth of all the prophets, that His Christ would suffer, He has thus" (Acts 3:18).
