consider that as obedience. He counts on his own, not on God's will, to assure him of a

When you say salvation is a, some people think it's too good to be true. They figure
they must their way to heaven by doing some great thing. They can't imagine God giving
us His, the forgiveness of our sins, and a home in heaven. Today, we're asking the
question, "What does it to be saved by the grace of God?"
Someone has taken the word grace and made the acrostic "G-R-A-C-E" "God's Redemption At
Christ's Expense." This is a fairly description of grace. The word grace (in Greek
charis) means "" The distinguishing factors of God's grace are twofold: first, God's
grace is a gift and is not; and second, God's grace is undeserved. Usually we think of
having to a place of favor with others, but God gives us his favor as a gift.
God accepts, loves, and blesses the person who stands in His grace. In spite of one's past, when a
person is in the blood of Jesus Christ, he stands in a right relationship and in the favor
of God. Even though we to be punished for our sins, God graciously us
and no longer holds our transgressions against us. In Christ, we became creatures,
transformed into children of God, and transferred into the kingdom of God. In Christ, God hears our
and gives us every spiritual blessing.

asked Moses to intercede for them with God, and Moses asked God to the serpents."
Then the LORD said to Moses, "You make a fiery serpent (that is, out of bronze), and you set it on
a standard; and it shall come about, that everyone who is bitten, when he at it, he will
live." So Moses made a bronze serpent and he set it on the standard; and it came about, that if a

The church belongs to the Lord because He it. The apostle Paul, by inspiration,
told the elders of the church at Ephesus, "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among
which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased

with His own " (Acts 20:28). If Jesus loved the church enough to for it, how
can we think so little of it? The church must be to the Lord.
The Bible reveals how related Christ is to the church in Ephesians 1:22-23. The
Bible says, "And He (that is, God) put all things in subjection under His feet (that is, Jesus' feet), and
gave Him as head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in
all." Just as your is inseparably connected to your body, so Christ is inseparably
connected to the church. Just as your body does your will as is conceived in the, so the
church does the will of its head, and that's Jesus Christ. The church is the of Christ. We

This difference of what we see today and what the Bible teaches and causes

in God's Word about the church. They need to think clearly about what God desires rather than be
pulled into a hope by something that calls itself church but differs greatly from the
church that Jesus built as found in the New Testament. The Scriptures clearly make the church that
Jesus built a necessity for us to engage in if we wish to God.
Why is the church so necessary? There are several reasons. First, the Lord those that He

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as the Lord grants forgiveness when one repents and is baptized, so the Lord adds the baptized to His church. The church is the of Christ!
When John wrote to the seven churches of Asia in Revelation 1, he revealed to them what Christ
had done for them. The Bible says, "Grace to you and peace, from Him who is and who was and who
is to come, and from the seven Spirits who are before His throne, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful

witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To Him who loves us and
released us from our by His blood—and He has made us to be a kingdom, priests to His
God and Father—and to Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen" (Revelation
1:4-6).
