### Born Again John 3:1-7

We hear a lot of folks about being "born again." What does that mean? We explore
God's Word because it contains the words of life. It teaches the most important lessons
and it gives us Today we're asking: what does it to be "born again" or "born from
above"? Is it some kind of "better than told" experience? Is it some feeling?
Some people speak of "born again" Christians as if they were a kind of Christian; but,
the fact is one must be "born again" to be a Christian at all. Since there is a lot of
about what it means to be "born again," it's worth our while to go back to the Bible and see what God
says about being "born again."

The Lord gives us that opportunity, an opportunity to put the old sinful person and to put

going to explore what this means and how this happens.
Our reading today comes from The Gospel According to John 3:1-7.
Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews, said, "Rabbi, we know that you're a come from God,
for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." The Lord Jesus is indeed the Son

understood what Jesus was talking about. Gentiles who became proselytes were thought to be "born
again" when they were Nicodemus was not a proselyte. He couldn't imagine being

Jesus makes it clear, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he
cannot the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is
born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again'" (John 3:5-7).
Even a ruler of the Jews needed what Jesus required for eternal life.
Jesus said, "You must be born again." That little word "must" means it's necessary if you want to
God. "Must" refers to a "moral necessity." Jesus later said that he "must go to Jerusalem,
and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up

have come" (2 Corinthians 5:17). In Christ the old man of sin has been put away, crucified with
Christ, so that a new man in Christ has come to be.
Ephesians 4:17-24 describes the that not only takes place spiritually but also in our
lives day to day. "So this I say, and affirm together with the Lord, that you walk no longer just as the
Gentiles also walk, in the futility of their mind, being darkened in their understanding, excluded from
the life of God because of the ignorance that's in them, because of the hardness of their heart; and
they, having become callous, have given themselves over to sensuality for the practice of every kind
of impurity with greediness. But you didn't learn Christ in this way, if indeed you've heard Him and
have been taught in Him, just as truth is in Jesus, that, in reference to your former manner of life, that
you lay aside the self, which is being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, and
that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the self, which in the likeness of
God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth." The new birth hearts,

This is the kind of life a Christian should live when he's born again. Ephesians 4:25-32 goes on
and describes this. "Therefore, laying aside falsehood, speak truth each one of you with his neighbor,
for we are of one another. Be angry, and yet do not sin; do not let the sun go down on
your anger, and do not give the devil an opportunity. He who steals must steal no longer; but rather
he must labor, performing with his own hands what is good, so that he will have something to share
with one who has need. Let no unwholesome proceed from your mouth, but only such a
word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those
who Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of
redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you,
along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in
Christ has forgiven you."
Christians leave the sinful and turn to the holy in because they become like Christ.
Paul said, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, and joy, and peace, patience, kindness, goodness,
faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law" (Galatians 5:22-23). A

person who is born of the Spirit shows these things. When you're born into the family of God, you have God as your \_\_\_\_\_. As a Fathe, God protects, provides, guides, instructs, and corrects. God gives His children the privilege of \_\_\_\_\_\_, listening to every request and every concern. He not only listens; He \_\_\_\_\_. In Christ, we're deeply blessed. Ephesians 1:3 says, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every (every, every) spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ." Being born into the family of God gives us \_\_\_\_\_ the privileges of God's favor and it gives us an inheritance. We are fellow-heirs with Christ. When you're born into God's family, the Lord \_\_\_\_\_ you to the church and He \_\_\_\_ your name in the Lamb's Book of Life. God says, "So then you're no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow with the saints, and you are of God's household, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the corner stone, in whom the whole building, being fitted together, is growing into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are being built together into a dwelling of God in the Spirit" (Ephesians 2:19-22). You can do \_\_\_\_\_\_ more important than to be born again! God wants you to be born again and to come into His family so He can love you and be close to you. So put your \_\_\_\_\_ in Him and turn away from sin. When you out of love obey Him in baptism, He'll crucify the old man of sin and cause you to be born again. Oh, what a blessing! Being born again \_\_\_\_\_ our lives entirely. Peter said of Christians, "But you are a chosen race, A royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; for you once were not a people, but now you are the people of God; you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy" (1 Peter 2:9-10). We turn from being a "nobody" to being "somebody" with God. We turn from shame to being a saint and from darkness to light. That's what it means to be born again, God's great blessing! Some people ask the question, "Can God really make me over?" They feel so \_\_\_\_\_\_ of their past, they don't believe they can live the Christian life. Oh, my friend, there's \_\_\_\_\_ news for you. If you want to change—I mean really want to become a child of God—there's \_\_\_\_\_ in the heart of God for you. The apostle Paul wasn't always an apostle. He was once Saul of Tarsus, a man who blasphemed Christ and persecuted Christians. He described himself as the \_\_\_\_\_ of sinners,\ since he had violently persecuted the church. Paul said, "It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost of all" (1 Timothy 1:15-16). The Lord loves \_\_\_\_\_ person on this earth, and the people He died for were all \_\_\_\_\_. Paul continues, "Yet for this reason I found mercy, so that in me as the foremost, Jesus Christ might demonstrate His perfect patience as an example for those who would believe in Him for eternal life." The Lord will also show you patience. You can go to heaven. You can be saved from all your sins and live eternally. How? You *must* be born again by believing with all your heart that Jesus is the Christ; repenting of your sins; confessing the name of Jesus; and by being baptized (that is, immersed

in water) for the forgiveness of your sins. That opportunity is yours if you'll take it and receive it.

Don't just believe, act on your faith!

### Authentic Christianity Acts 26:24-29

When people speak of Christianity, it's often quite from what the New
Testament teaches about Christianity. What is authentic Christianity; what is it really? If
you ask the question, "what is Christianity?" people will give you all kinds of
They'll tell you what they it were. People see
Christianity historically and socially as it in America; but if that's all they see, they
may never know what Christianity is. Today we're exploring the question, "What is
authentic Christianity?" Is the Christianity we see today what God when He sent
Jesus into this world? In the early days Christians were known among themselves as "brethren,"
"the faithful," "the elect," "saints" (all of them were called saints), and they were also thought of
as "believers." But people outside the church called them "Christians." This term came by the
of God, and it was universally accepted.
You might think the word "Christian" would occur frequently in the New Testament, but it
occurs only times. The word "Christian" refers to an individual who " to
Christ." Originally, words that ended in the letters "i-a-n" applied to the belonging to
the great households; it had passed into regular use to refer to of an individual or a
party. Some Bible dictionaries define the word "Christian" as "The name given by the Greeks or
Romans, probably in, to the followers of Jesus. It was first used at Antioch."
However, the name "Christian" is far more than that, as we will see.
Our reading today in the New Testament comes from the book of Acts 26:24-29.
The first time "Christian" is used in the New Testament is Acts 11:25-26. "So Barnabas went
to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. For a whole
year they met with the church and taught a great many people. And in Antioch the disciples were
first called Christians." The word for "called" here is <i>chrematisai</i> , not the common word for
"called" from the word <i>kalleo</i> . <i>Chrematisai</i> refers to a revealed name or instruction.
The name "Christian" didn't actually come from; it came from in fulfillment of
the prophecy found in Isaiah 62:2: "The nations will see your righteousness, And all kings your
glory; And you will be called by a name, Which the mouth of the LORD will designate."
To call myself a Christian means that I am a of Christ. I wear His name; I follow
His teaching; I call upon him as my Lord, and share in His spiritual and moral way of life. A
is a person who imitates his master, becomes like him in manner, in speech, in mind,
and in behavior. The disciples were called Christians. Both words, "disciples" and "Christians,"
show the relationship between the Lord Jesus and those who follow him. I am happy
and honored to wear the name of Jesus Christ. I love Him and I want to wear His name. And I don't mind the world knowing that I am His servent
don't mind the world knowing that I am His servant.

The second time the word "Christian" is used is also found in the book of Acts. In chapter 26,
Paul is defending himself and his before the Roman governor Festus and the Jewish
king, Herod Agrippa. "'King Agrippa, do you believe the prophets? I know that you believe.' And
Agrippa said to Paul, 'In a short time would you persuade me to be a Christian?' And Paul said,
'Whether short or long, I would to God that not only you but also all who hear me this day might
become such as I am—except for these chains" (Acts 26:27-29). Paul wished
were a Christian, and so do I. I hope you're a Christian.
People to be Christians; nobody is born one. We might be into a family
of Christians, but that doesn't make us a Christian. We have to for ourselves. We
must be born to become a Christian. We do that when we by faith decide to follow
Christ and to be The Bible says, "Do you not know that when you present
yourselves to someone as slaves for obedience, that you're slaves of the one whom you obey,
either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness? But thanks be to God
that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to
which you were committed, and having been freed from sin, you became the slaves of
righteousness" (Romans 6:16-18). You can become a Christian by your heartfelt
to the gospel. Each of you, each of all of us, must choose to believe and to obey.
The Bible teaches in Ephesians about the that takes place when a person
becomes a Christian. Read Ephesians 4:17-24. You must make a change when you
decide to become a Christian. You must leave an sinful way of life, a way that's

The third Scripture which mentions the name "Christian" is 1 Peter 4:15-16. These verses say:
"But let none of you suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as a meddler. Yet if anyone
suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in that name." In this
passage, the Bible says that one should not be of being a Christian but to glorify
God in THAT name, that God-given name that associates us with Jesus Christ, our Lord.
Christians were undergoing serious at the time that Peter wrote this to them. I
could see how some might feel hesitant to that they were Christians, if it meant
persecution. Others might if they acted sinfully and brought reproach upon their faith.
But wearing the name of Christ honorably glorifies God. This is truly the name that God
designates for his people.
The apostle Paul, like Peter, was willing to whatever shame and punishment was
necessary in order to preach the gospel and to serve the Lord Jesus Christ. Paul felt obligated to
the Lord in a pagan society. He said, "I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. So, for my part, I'm to preach the gospel
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to you also who are in Rome. For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the of God
for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek" (Romans 1:14-16).
No one has to be ashamed of the gospel of the Lord Jesus because of all the that Christ
does in their lives.
A Christian doesn't have to be ashamed when he up without a hangover. A Christian
doesn't have to be ashamed that he tells the, that he keeps his word, that he practices
what is right, and that he loves his neighbor. The way of Christians is God's way, God's plan to

What does it mean then to be a Christian? It means: I don't belong to me; I
belong to my Lord Jesus Christ. I have given Him place in my life. I believe what He

themselves Christians, but they're only fair-weather Christians.

The Bible says, "For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and then transferred us to the
of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins"
(Colossians 1:13-14). Jesus took us from sin and darkness and brought us into the kingdom of
hope and peace and promise. He us from an evil world and brought us to the love of
God. How could we imagine living ungodly lives when we consider all that he has done for us?
First Corinthians 6:19-20 says, "Or do you not know that your body is a of the Holy
Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have

In the book of Philippians, Paul described himself in chapter one and verse one as a bond-
servant of Christ Jesus. To be a bond-servant means that I am a slave, a slave in chains to my

Are you one of the redeemed? Have you become a Christian? To become one, believe with all
your heart that Jesus is the Christ, repent of your sins, confess the name of Christ, and be baptized.

## Knowing Christ John 17:1-5

People say, "knowledge is" If you could closely and personally know
someone who could give you eternal life, would you want to Him? Eternal life
can be yours! If we could live with good health, joy, peace, and love, we'd feel
truly blessed! The fact is: while this life on earth is temporary and filled with troubles,
there's an eternal life beyond with joy, peace, and love. You can have this
eternal life and much more; it's! It comes by the grace of God and by knowing
Jesus Christ. The Lord Jesus in a prayer to His Father said, "This is eternal life, that they
may know You, the only God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent" (John 17:3).
Eternal life is not merely living forever and ever; eternal life is a of life
built upon a relationship with God who gave us our life. We have eternal life because we
know—and we have that close relationship with—God! To know God well will bring
about and devotion. To let God's permeate our heart and our life
brings about the greatest blessings. God's life is the best life forever; it's true life forever;
it's love forever; peace forever, and joy forever! Eternal life can be yours, if you let it.
The inspired apostle Paul said, "For not one of us lives for himself, and not one dies for
himself; for if we live, we live for the Lord, or if we die, we die for the Lord; therefore
whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, that
He might be Lord both of the dead and of the living" (Romans 14:7-9). Eternal life means I

The Bible helps us to understand who God is and what His is for our lives.
Read what the Bible says in Romans 10:14-17. We come to in God by

God says. Acts 17:11 says, "Now these were more noble-minded than those in
Thessalonica, for they received the word with great eagerness, examining the Scriptures
daily, to see whether those things were so." The Bible helps us distinguish what is and is
not about God. Many articles and television programs say things about God that
simply are not to tell you the truth. You
should what you hear by the Scriptures. Without the Scriptures we lose
spiritually. There's a significant between people who know the Lord and

People who don't believe in God or love God don't realize what they in
rejecting God. They become futile in their, selfish, callous, and confused.
People who God turn to selfishness and sin which ruins their lives. It ought to

Read what the Bible says in Galatians 5:19-21. You can't have sin as the focus of your

lets sin him, while the other finds in Christ. One lets his selfish

God spoke through the prophet Hosea to Israel who had forgotten Him and had
followed the pagan nations. They no longer knew God, and their apathy toward God
them. God said, "My people are destroyed for of knowledge. Because
you have rejected knowledge, I also will reject you from being My priest. Since you have
forgotten the law of your God, I also will forget your children" (Hosea 4:6). When people

Read what the Bible says in Romans 1:18-26. Again, the Bible says: "For those who
are according to the flesh set their on the things of the flesh, but those who are
according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. For the mind set on the flesh is,
but the mind set on the Spirit is and peace, because the mind set on the flesh is
hostile toward God; for it doesn't subject itself to the law of God, for it is not even able to
do so, and those who are in the flesh cannot God" (Romans 8:5-8).
God loves us so much, however, that He wants to our hearts and our minds
away from what will destroy us to what will bless us. God wants to bring you back to
Himself. That's why He sent Jesus into the world. Romans 5:6-8 says, "For while we were
still, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will hardly die for
a righteous man; though perhaps for the good man someone would dare even to die. But
God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet, Christ
died for us." God was willing to go to that extent so that you might have a life
on earth and live with Him in joy and in love

I get to travel throughout the United States and usually fly out from the Oklahoma City
airport. I sometimes have to fly when the are filled with dark clouds and rain. You
can easily get wet and cold. Going through the airport lines and waiting to board the airplane
can be stressful. But there's an experience in an airplane that never gets to me. It
reminds me of something that I need to know. No matter how dark, how wet, how cold, or how
dreary a day may be, the sun still above the clouds. The clouds may temporarily
out the sun, but the sun is still shining. Life may seem dark and dreary on earth, but
the brightness of the sun hasn't diminished one bit. Truth may seem for a time by
our culture, but it's not lost or any less true. The Bible urges us to "Buy truth, and do not sell it,

taking the time to it out in the Word of God. God wants us to the truth

certain than a twenty-four hour day. They are truths that are eternal, and they will
last longer than the You can be sure of them. They are absolutes.
First, you can be sure that exists and He is eternal. The Bible says, "For since the
creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal and divine,
have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without
excuse" (Romans 1:20). The existence of the sun, moon, and stars clearly of the
eternal powers and the divine nature of God. Psalm 19:1 says, "The Heavens declare the glory
of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork."
Our own physical bodies bear witness that a very powerful and intelligent Being
us. The more you know about how complex and intricate your body is, the more you'll realize
that we could never be the of an accident or evolution. We are designed physically
and morally by God. It's clear that God designed us to live in this If this world was
different or we were different, we could never have survived. Without an intelligent Designer
and a moral Designer, this world wouldn't make sense. You can be sure there is a God.
Moses proclaimed, "LORD, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the
mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from
everlasting to everlasting you are God" (Psalm 90:1-2).
Second, you can be sure that Jesus is the Divine Son of God. The Bible says, "In the
beginning was the Word, and the Word was God, and the Word God. He
was in the beginning with God. And all things were made him, and without him
was not anything made that was made" (John 1:1-3). In verse 14 of this same chapter, John 1,
the Bible says, "And the Word became flesh, and among us, and we saw His glory,
glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth." Jesus has always been
Divine. He became flesh and dwelled among us.
The Scriptures go on to say about Jesus, "The Father loves the Son and has given all things
into His hand. He who believes in the Son has eternal life; but he who does not the
Son will not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him" (John 3:35-36). God has made Jesus
Lord and has given everything into His hands. He has all in heaven and on earth
(Matthew 28:18). He is Lord of all and has authority over all flesh (John 17:2).
Moses predicted that Jesus would come and be Lord of all. Acts 3:22-24 quotes Moses
saying, "The Lord God will raise up for you a like me from your brothers. You

shall to him in whatever he tells you. And it shall be that every soul who does not
listen to that prophet shall be destroyed from the people." Because Jesus is the Lord and is the
Son of God, the most important thing that you can do is listen and Him.
Third, you can be sure that God's is true and it's eternal. Psalm 119:89
proclaims, "Forever, O Lord, your word is firmly fixed (or settled) in the heavens." God's
Word doesn't with the generations; it remains the same. It was true when it was
written and it's true today. When Jesus told the devil, "It is written," in Luke 4, He
was making it that what God had Moses write some 1200-1500 years before was
still true and authoritative. One might translate the phrase, "it is written" as "it
written." God wrote it, and nothing can its authority. It stands because God meant
for it to stand. You can deny it, avoid it, hide it, or debate it; you can even get everyone to
agree with you against the Word; but at the end of the day God's Word stands as
the spiritual and moral authority in our lives. God's Word stands because God stands! God's
Word is the inspired Word, the authoritative Word, and it's the last Word. The Lord Jesus
promised in Matthew 24:35, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass
away." God's book, God's only book, the Bible, will when everything else is gone.
Read 1 Peter 1:23-25.
The Lord Jesus said, "The one who rejects me and does not receive my words has a
; the word that I have spoken will judge him on the last day" (John 12:48). We will
be judged by every word the Lord Jesus speaks. You can't the Words of Jesus

You'll be judged by them, not by opinion polls or the ideas of the day. You can be sure God's
Word will be present on the last day, the Day of Judgment.
Fourth, you can be sure of the of God for His people. God's love is undeserved;
it's intentional; and it's sacrificial. God loves us even when we don't to be loved,
and His grace is greater than our sins. God's love is intentional. Jesus laid down His on
His own initiative. God isn't obligated to us; we're obligated to Him. He intentionally chose to
love and bless us. God's love is He so loved us that He was willing to sacrifice
His only begotten Son Jesus, and Jesus bore our sins in his body; it was personal, so that we
might to sin and to righteousness (1 Peter 2:24). According to 2 Corinthians
5:21, God made Jesus, who knew no sin, to be sin on our behalf that we might become the
righteousness of God in Him.
The love of God is far greater than I can understand or even describe. There's never been a
moment when God has not loved His people. Read what Romans 8:35-39 asks.
