times going to the Lord is the only real option we have. Whether we know it or not, we all need
God. We need His love, His peace, His joy, His hope, and His salvation.
Jesus is real and genuine. He has Himself time and again to be everything that He

you through the toughest of times. Some think of Jesus as merely one among many religious
, but Jesus is quite unique. Who else was born of a virgin? Who else fulfilled so
many Old Testament prophecies? Who else arose from the dead? Who else could raise the dead,
heal the sick, or walk upon water? If these are just myths, how do you account for so many
disciples holding to them with their last breath?
How do you account for the that Jesus fulfilled? He was in
Bethlehem, fulfilling the prophecy of Micah 5:2. He was the seed of woman. He had his hands
and his feet as Psalm 22:16 says. He was betrayed for thirty pieces of as

Zechariah 11:12 says. He was to die with the wicked, and be buried with the as Isaiah
53 prophesies. Oh, there are dozens of prophecies in the Old Testament about the of
Jesus Christ, the Messiah. Jesus fulfilled one of those prophecies. No other person in
all of has done that or could do that. To fulfill so many specific prophecies shows
that He is from Centuries before he was born and centuries after, men still looked to
Jesus as the person of all history. This is still 'AD 2016,'"the year of our Lord, 2016."
Unfortunately, many have the Lord Jesus. I was shocked when I learned that
the fastest religious group in America describe themselves as unaffiliated. Nearly
one in four Americans says that they have religion. Many of these came from Christian
, and for whatever reason they abandoned their faith in Jesus. They are the "un-
churched" and place no allegiance in anything Perhaps you're a person choosing
to be "without God and without hope in this present world." When you abandon God, realize
this! You also abandon God's help and hope, His peace and joy, and His love and grace.
Where will you go, my friend, to find what the Lord Jesus can give? No one else has
what He has. No one can give you what He can give you. No one will ever love you the way the
Lord loves you. You might have a thousand friends in your lifetime, but which of your friends
has ever for you? Which one ever felt the repeated of a cruel whip on his
back? Which one ever took through his hands and feet? Which one ever
suspended between heaven and earth until he could breathe no more for you? Which of your
friends ever took your upon himself and died for them? You can search the world over
and never find anyone who will love you like Jesus did.!
The apostle Paul said, "For while we were still, at the right time Christ died for
the ungodly. For one will hardly die for a righteous man; though perhaps for the man
someone would dare even to die. But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while
we were yet, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8). The Lord Jesus died for us, not
because we had befriended Him, but because He had come to us. We were helpless,
ungodly, and sinners; but Jesus died for us anyway. You can't that kind of love; it's
much deeper than a casual friendship. It's the kind of love that we all long for, the kind of love
that we cannot ignore or forget.
It's hard for me to understand what in the heart of a person who forgets what
Jesus did for him. The Hebrew writer warns, "Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of
you an evil, unbelieving heart that from the living God. But
one another day after day, as long as it's still called "Today," so that none of you will be
hardened by the deceitfulness of sin" (Hebrews 3:12-13). Yes, sin can deceive our and
harden them. People can become enslaved to some favorite sin to the point that they'll

You may not be caught up in sin, but your sin can you from God and His

years—it's still death. I would hate to see you your heart against God. If you do,
realize that God will say no to you for the life hereafter. My friend, once this life is over, you
can't turn back the You can't wish your choices away. You will face the Lord!
Whether you face the Lord on that day, the Day of Judgment, with joy and peace or with
dread and panic is up to you. You're actually choosing life or death by your choice of whether to
the Lord or not. If you reject the Lord, you will not find any for the
hereafter. You might find great success today; you might become rich and famous; you might
have great power and influence, and have the pleasures of life at every turn; but if you don't
have the Lord Jesus in your life, you're putting your at risk of being lost eternally. Paul
said, "she who gives herself to wanton is dead even while she lives" (1 Timothy
5:6). I suspect today there are many, many people physically but spiritually
in their trespasses and sins.
What should you do if you find that you are living without the of the cross? Take
a long, long look at the cross; the love of Christ with the way that you're living
your life. The cross has a way of humbling us and convicting us of sin. We've all grievously
fallen short of the glory of God. We all deserve to be lost, but the Lord out of love paid the price
to rescue us.

what God says. You believe what He teaches and you're willing to His instructions.

<b>8:5-8</b> . You can't continue following the of the flesh and think God won't mind.
He knows your heart, and a mind set on the flesh cannot please God.
So, Paul urges us, "But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the
flesh. For the flesh sets its desire against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; for these are
in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things that you please" (Galatians 5:16-
17). When people follow the flesh and the world, they actually make themselves an
of God according to James 4:4. Following the world will do nothing but your life and
your soul. Galatians 5:24 says, "Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh
with its passions and desires." My friend, do you follow Christ or do you follow your passions?
Third, we must love God than others. The Lord Jesus said, "He who loves father or
mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is
not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me.
He who has found his life will lose it, and he who has lost his life for My sake will find it"
(Matthew 10:37-39). The Lord expects us to put Him in all things, even before our
loved ones. We may have a family member who challenges our to Christ. We
cannot let our love for anyone in our family lead us from God or from His teaching.
If we let people come between God and ourselves, we're not of Christ. Though we
are to love all people, even our enemies, we must love Christ even more.
John tells of some Jewish leaders who believed in Jesus but loved their friends more than
they loved God. John 12:42-43 says, "Nevertheless many even of the believed in

Him, but because of the Pharisees they were not confessing Him, for that they would
be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the approval of men rather than the approval of
God." They believed, but were unwilling to it openly. They didn't want to lose their
status in the community. So, they feared the Pharisees more than God and loved their place in
the community more than the approval of God.
Fourth, we must love Christ more than our Paul is the perfect example of
someone who gave up in his past in order to follow Christ. Read what he
said in Philippians 3:4-8.
Paul left his place in Judaism to become a Christian. He "was advancing in Judaism beyond
many of my contemporaries among my countrymen, being more extremely zealous for my
ancestral traditions" (Galatians 1:14). But, all that heritage, all of it couldn't do what
could do for him. He wanted Christ! He wanted to be right with God! My friend, do you?
Fifth, we need to the Lord in the way that pleases Him, not ourselves. Worship
by its very is a means of honoring, praising, and showing respect for the Person
that we worship. We want God to be pleased with our sacrifices. Hebrews 13:15-16 says,
"Through Him (that is, through Christ) then, let us continually offer up a sacrifice of
to God, that is, the fruit of lips that give thanks to His name. And do not neglect doing good and
sharing, for with such God is pleased." God wants His people to their
hearts, their lips, and their lives in worship to Him.
God accepted the worship that Abel offered, but He refused to accept Cain or his sacrifices.
Hebrews 11:4 explains, "By faith Abel offered to God a sacrifice than Cain, through
which he obtained the testimony that he was righteous, God testifying about his gifts, and
through faith, though he is dead, he still speaks." Abel's gift was by, while Cain's gifts

Sixth, we must not let other interfere with our service to God. The apostle Paul
told the young preacher Timothy, "You therefore, my son, be in the grace that is in
Christ Jesus. The things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, you
entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also. Suffer hardship with me, as a
good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier in active service entangles himself in the affairs of

everyday life, so that he may the one who enlisted him as a soldier" (2 Timothy 2:1-4).
We can get so with our own lives that we our commitment to God. The
Lord Jesus described how some hearts were like seed sown on thorny soil. "The seed which fell
among the thorns, these are the ones who have heard, and as they go on their way they are
choked with worries and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no to maturity"
(Luke 8:14). You can hardly serve the Lord when you allow every that blows to
come before Him, and His instructions, and the way He wants you to live, and going to church.
Whenever you let other things interfere with your God, then you really can't
please Him.

Is God \_\_\_\_\_\_? We want to know all we can about God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ; and the way to know God is through a \_\_\_\_\_\_ of His Word, the Bible. So, we go again and again to Scripture. How we view God matters greatly in how we view \_\_\_\_\_ and how we understand our purpose and role in this world. An atheist does not believe God \_\_\_\_\_ at all. An agnostic says he doesn't know whether God exists, because he thinks God is unknowable. Some believe God got the world going and then abandoned it. Others hold that belief in God was relevant in ancient times, but God is now dead. We no longer \_\_\_\_\_ God in our lives today according to them. Several years ago in graduate school, I spent a couple of semesters studying skeptics and atheists. One thing I found was that skepticism and atheism grew more out of an \_\_\_\_\_ than it did out of evidence. Atheists and skeptics tended to \_\_\_\_\_ on the disorder and the ugly in life. They seemed to \_\_\_\_\_ the order, the beauty, the grandeur, and the wisdom so evident in our universe. 8:28 says, "And we know that God causes all things to work together for to those who
love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." God doesn't stop every event of
suffering, but God does use even suffering to work for our We don't always
understand what God is doing or why; but we know that God us and will use every
circumstance in our lives, pleasing or painful, to work for good in some way. We can trust God!
Read what David, who was inspired of God, said in Psalm 103:1-5.
God has been working in our lives a very time. He isn't hidden, but we do get
distracted by life and sometimes we're unable to what He's doing. The Bible reminds us
of all the good that God is doing us and us. Paul said, "And now I commend you
to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the

Second, Jesus came into the world so that we might know God's will for our lives. Read
John 3:1-2. Jesus was first and foremost a teacher; He wanted people not only to know God
but to know the of God. So, Jesus held this teaching to be essential to us. John 6:63
says, "the words that I have to you are spirit and are life." We must know and
the words of the Lord. Read what the Lord Jesus said in Matthew 7:21-23.
You cannot say no to the of the Lord without saying no to the Lord Himself.
Jesus wanted us to know His teaching because it will be the basis for our on the
Last Day. Jesus took special to deliver the teaching accurately and faithfully. Read
what the Lord said in John 12:48-50.
When the Bible teaches something, you can be it's what the Lord Jesus wants us to
know. Don't trust your feelings, or your assumptions, or the teachings of men, or anything but
what you can in your New Testament. The only way that you can know the will of the
Father for is by looking at the words of Jesus Christ.
Third, Jesus came into the world so that we might have a relationship with God. Read what
the Bible says in John 1:11-13. God wants everybody to come to Him and to be His,
but not everyone wants to do His will.
God will forgive anyone's who will believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, repent of sin,
and be baptized. The gospel is for, Jew and Gentile, male and female, slave or free.
Anyone who loves the Lord and is willing to obey Him can be and become a child of
God. The apostle Peter said to the Roman Gentile, Cornelius, "I most certainly understand now
that God is not one to show partiality, but in every nation the man who Him and does
what is is welcome to Him" (Acts 10:34-35).
People who to be close to the Lord but are unwilling to do the will of God fool
themselves. You can't continue to live in rebellion to the will of God and then expect to have a
relationship with the Lord. The Lord wants to draw close to you; but if you reject
His will, you're rejecting Him, and His blessing.

me, this is amazing. God gave up His Son to a crucifixion, the worst and most shameful death
