Overcoming Temptation 1 Corinthians 10:6-13

What do you do when you're to sin? Today, we're going to learn some ways to
temptation. Life challenges us every day, but God's Word provides to
those challenges. Life's problems can overwhelm us, but God's Word can us. In a
world filled with sin, we need the Lord's help! Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a
to my feet And a to my path." It leads us in the paths of righteousness and
away from the dangers that can us. This is why we listen and study the Word of God.
From the moment that we're old enough to understand right from wrong, truth from error, and
good from evil, we the temptation to please our selfish desires rather than to please God.
Temptations come in many, and what affects one person may not affect another. Some
are to tell a lie, some to steal, some to take revenge, some to gossip. When we're
afraid or hurting, we may be tempted to get or to strike out. When we're greedy or
jealous, we may be tempted to what is not ours or to put others down. The devil strives
to make sin, but sin is offensive to God.
With the Lord's help, you can overcome Satan's schemes and his tricks to you astray.
With the Lord's help, you can find to overcome sin. With the Lord's help, you can

Our reading today comes from the First Epistle of Paul to the Corinthians 10:6-13.
The apostle John describes the three appeals that Satan uses to us toward the world and
away from God. First John 2:15-17 says, "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If
anyone loves the world, the love of the is not in him. For all that is in the world—the
lust of the, the lust of the, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the
world. And the world is away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God
abides forever." Every temptation comes in one or more of these three forms. The devil uses our
to lead us astray from God.
James warned, "Let no one say when he is tempted, 'I am tempted by'; for God cannot
be tempted by evil, nor does He Himself tempt anyone. But each one is tempted when he is
by his own desires and enticed. Then, when desire has conceived, it gives
to sin; and sin, when it's full-grown, brings forth" (James 1:13-15).
Satan appealed to the flesh, the eyes, and pride when he tempted to eat of the fruit of
the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Genesis tells how Satan tried to get Eve to what
God said by appealing to her desires. Read the story in Genesis 3:1-5.

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The devil first tries to get people to God. He wants to make them think God is
trying to withhold some from them. Once Satan gets people to be self-centered rather
than believing in God, he's able to tell them that contradict God. Jesus told some Jews
who did not believe in Him, "You are of your father the devil, and the desires of your father you
want to do. He was a from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because
there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a
and the father of it. But because I tell the truth, you do not believe Me" (John 8:44-45).
The devil urges people to in their own judgment rather than to God. Of
course, trusting your own judgment will you to give in to your desires. Satan tempted
Jesus to use His to make food. Read the temptation of Jesus in Matthew 4:1-4.
Jesus said no to the devil, because Jesus knew His relationship to God was! God
helps us overcome temptation by us who we are in Christ. We don't belong to
ourselves but to Him, to Christ, who purchased us with His God also helps us by giving

Solomon advised his son: "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and lean not on your
understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Do not be

than for your whole body to be cast into hell" (Matthew 5:27-29).

activities outside of marriage often feel great for what they've done and wished that
they had never violated God's will.
Christians must be careful what they at. They should their eyes away from
the things that tempt them sexually, so that they may remain pure in their thoughts. Young men
who love the Lord learn to their eyes and avoid temptation. Young women need to
consider how they, so that they might not tempt young men or send the wrong message.
We all must be careful not to tempt to sin. A young woman who dresses in a sexually
provocative way shouldn't be that boys will see her as willing to be sexy. Young
women who profess godliness should dress modestly (1 Timothy 2:9-10). When people, and that's

and the Word of God teaches us how! The Word tells us how to ourselves

the storms. It challenges us to make us brighter and stronger. It gives to
stretch our minds and our behaviors. We're blessed beyond measure to possess a copy of
God's Holy Word!
All four of our children are now grown. Jackie and I watched them mature into responsible
and loving people, and we're proud of them. We raised them to be and to pursue
lives of their own. We didn't want them to be childish. We wanted our daughters to be like
Jesus, who matured as God desired. Luke 2:52 says, "And Jesus kept in

church, and some have ceased to in Jesus Christ. Because much of Christianity is

22:3 says, "The prudent sees the evil and hides himself, But the naive go on, and are punished
for it." Mature Christians have taken time to through the moral and spiritual

trouble. Proverbs 14:18 says, "The naive inherit foolishness, But the sensible are crowned
with knowledge." The difference between being naïve and prudent matter.

The <i>Encyclopedia of American Religions</i> lists 2,300 religions. Religion in America is terribly and diverse these days. So how can know you what's really about God? The
Bible provides the out of confusion and into religious truth. This Word has stood the test of
time; and the more you know about the Bible, the more you'll what it has to say.
We live in the most religiously culture of all time. You might wonder you
should choose Christianity. There are so many different kinds of Christianity, you might wonder why
you should choose one over another. Religious division doubt, cynicism,
arguments, broken families, and broken friendships. So, we ask, "How can we find our way out of all
the confusion?"
Our nation is like the ancient city of In the first century, Athens was full of
devoted to pagan deities. The Greek writer Pausanius said the Athenians worshiped the
gods more than any others and had more religion than any other But, we too are a
religiously diverse There are major denominations of Christianity and
countless independent groups. This division is confusing; and it's no wonder the growing
religious group in America is the one that replies, "no religion." The number of people who don't go to
church has from 39 million in 1991 to 75 million people today. This diversity has brought
nothing but division and confusion. We believe there is something and something
from God. And, it's right where it's always been.
Our reading today comes from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 3:1-7. That's a great
for us today as well as for those in the time of Timothy.
In Acts 17:16, the Bible says, "Now while Paul was waiting for them at Athens, his spirit was
provoked within him as he saw that the city was of idols." It should provoke the
of any faithful Christian today to see so much religious confusion. There are so many
saying so many different things and that must leave us trying to figure out what is the truth. What Paul
did in a religiously divided world was simply to the gospel of Christ.
Acts 17:17-18 says, "So he in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons,
and in the marketplace every day with those who happened to be there. Some of the Epicurean and
Stoic philosophers also conversed with him. Some said, 'What does this babbler wish to say?' Others
said, 'He seems to be a preacher of divinities'—because he was preaching Jesus and the
resurrection."
Epicurus, who lived 300 years before Christ, held that was the chief goal of life, and
wanted a life free from pain, passions, superstitions, fears, and anxiety about death. He believed in the
gods but thought they didn't really care, so he pursued pleasure. A contemporary, Zeno, founded the
Stoics and emphasized man's and self-sufficiently. For him, God was everywhere; it was

the "World-soul." Neither the Stoics nor the Epicureans ever understood the of God! Some
of them with Paul and called him a "babbler." Babblers to them were a ne'er do well and
they put forth other people's ideas as their own and didn't understand what they were
about. Paul was not a babbler; the babblers were the Athenians who spent all their time talking and
listening, hoping to hear something
So, they invited Paul to at Mars Hill. Read what Paul said in Acts 17:22-25.
Many today think they God. But, the God they think they know and the God
of the Bible are often quite different. People confuse themselves when they believe their perceptions of
God rather than what the Bible actually about God. Their perceived God is quite different
from the God who them. Many want a God of their own who always agrees
with them rather than the God of Scripture. Popular religion would have you believe that God so loves
everyone and is so full of grace that He accepts us just as we are, even if we never of our

Some say that "sin" is an word that no longer people should use. They imagine
using the words "sin" or "sinner" is offensive and keeps people from to Jesus. The Bible,
however, says that Jesus "came into the world to save" (1 Timothy 1:15), and he "died for
our sins, according to the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3). Sin is not merely breaking a law; it is

lives. Read what Paul said at Athens in Acts 17:30-31. God demands repentance and will
people in righteousness at the end. You can be of it, because God raised Jesus from the dead!
Any preacher who doesn't you to repent is not a gospel preacher.
In the paganism of old, everyone had their god. They chose the god that they liked. The
idols of Greece couldn't; they didn't have a Bible, and asked nothing of their followers.
Idolatry was often associated with sexual immorality, and paganism allowed people to in sin.
That's very convenient to serve a god that expects out of you. As long as you didn't mess
with their god, they didn't mess with yours. Everyone could believe as he and would leave
each other alone. That's very similar to our culture of "live and let live."
But, this is why Paul was a trouble-maker by the Athenians; and frankly, Biblical
Christianity is thought to be troublemakers today. It doesn't live and let live. Jesus asks for people to

Bible itself cause the confusion, or is it that we tend to place our own above the Bible?
The Bible was written to be understood, but God also wants us to understand it Like a
textbook in school, the Bible was written for groups of people to and use. Why would God
give us a Bible that we could not understand and then tell us that He will judge on the basis of that
book? God is in the business of not confusing.
Paul said to the Ephesians, "When you read this (speaking about what he had written), you can
perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, which was not made known to the sons of men in other
generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit. This mystery is
that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ
Jesus through the gospel" (Ephesians 3:4-6). In the New Testament, a mystery was not an unsolvable
riddle but something from one generation but to another. Jesus made some
to us that can help us through this confusion.
The Lord Jesus said, "If you in my word, you are truly disciples of mine, and you will
know the truth, and the truth will set you" (John 8:31-32). The way to know the truth is to
the Bible, to stay in the Word, and not abandon it for human opinions or human traditions.
Only the Word of God can set us free from sin, free from darkness, and free from the confusion of our
day. The Bible will bring to a confused and decaying society. We need the Bible now more
than ever! We ought to be grateful that the Lord us enough to tell us the truth!
Jesus also promised the apostles, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them
now. But when the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into the truth" (John 16:12-13). We
not only can know the truth, we can know the truth that leads to life and godliness in the
revealed Word of God. We're not anything that God intended for us. The Bible is all-
sufficient and can us for every good work. Second Timothy 3:16-17 says, "All Scripture is
inspired by God and for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in
righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work." Don't settle
for opinions or assumptions. Don't settle for human traditions that stand outside the Bible. Go to the
Bible. If you can't find it in Scripture, don't believe it or practice it.
Why is there so much religious confusion? People listening to God and His revealed

on confusion. When you have confusion, people end up doing what they They live without
