how to avoid it. It will keep their hearts toward God and shape their consciences for good.
The Word of God teaches us how to our neighbor, how to our enemies, and
how to the wrongs that we suffer. The Word of God people toward sacrifice

Sixth, parents, teach your children and reverence. Children who are respectful learn
how to, and in time how to discipline themselves. Children who don't respect their parents
or God find their lives of heartaches and failure. Parents also find their lives full of
heartache over their children. Parents must establish loving authority over a child in life. If
they do, they'll find their children happy and secure. But if parents don't gain their children's
respect early, they will have a battle with their children for years; and no one will be happy.
Proverbs 29:15 says, "The rod and reproof give wisdom, but a child who gets his own way brings
shame to his mother."
The Bible says, "The Lord is exalted, for he dwells on high; he will fill Zion with justice and
righteousness, and he will be the stability of your times, abundance of salvation, wisdom, and
knowledge; the of the Lord is Zion's treasure" (Isaiah 33:5-6). When children learn to

Seventh, give them your and blessing. Little children often come to understand their

forgiveness from their parents have a harder time believing can forgive them, too. Children
who have parents that reject them often think God might reject them, too. Children can arrive at the
wrong conclusions about God when their parents don't them as they should. I've known
some children who had to until adulthood and they left home before they ever understood
how much God loves them. Oh, parents, teach them early! Teach them well about God!
When your child reaches an accountable age, knowing right from wrong, you must teach them
God's will and how to the gospel and become a Christian. Teach them what God expects
of them when they become a Christian. God saves us by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8); and we
can't our salvation, but God gives us conditions for our salvation. God expects us to love,
trust, and Him. Teach your children to the Lord Jesus. When they love the Lord
Jesus, they'll find living for Him a! To persuade our children means teaching them
intellectually, and also touching their hearts. Teach them facts, teach them about the Lord, and teach
them to love the Lord Jesus. Teach them what He expects of them, but also how He is gracious and
forgiving when they fail. Give your children that they can live the Christian life.

to believe, it also teaches how to live righteous and fruitful lives for the Lord. No other book
provides the wisdom, the spiritual insight, and the practical advice about relationships and life that
the provides. When you fail to study God's Word, you cheat yourself out of a treasure of
The Bible can give you the wisdom you need for your own journey of faith and can
help you your children faithful as they mature into adulthood.
The Bible not only provides some of the things we can do to help our children grow in
their faith, it also helps us the things that hinder faith. You can't your children
to do what is right if you aren't practicing what you're teaching them. Your actions will speak
louder than your words, and your teenagers are old enough to see whether you're in
your faith and devotion to God. Teens are looking toward the day when they can make their
decisions and live as they please. If they lack a solid spiritual foundation, or if they see hypocrisy
and compromise, they'll likely fail to take the Lord and His Word seriously. Parents, devote
yourself to the Lord and His Word. This will help your children in the Lord as well.

in my ways" (Proverbs 23:26). Parents, do your children delight in your ways as a Christian?
You must set the of the life that you want them to live. If you want them to be
moral, then for them a moral lifestyle. If you want them to up their speech, then
you must clean up your speech. If you want them to avoid bad that can hurt them, then
show them how to abstain from destructive behaviors.
Your children will how to live and how to react to life from you. If you get angry often,
why would it surprise you when your child shows anger? If you hold a grudge when your teenager
misbehaves, how will he learn what it means to be forgiven? Your teen will live out his Christianity
not only by how you live, but also by how you him or her. Sadly, some teens quit the Lord
because of the their "Christian" parents treated them. Others quit the Lord because they saw
compromise and hypocrisy in their parents' spiritual lives. If you want your children to be devoted
to the Lord, then you devote yourself. You must show yourself an example in "speech,
conduct, love, faith and purity" (1 Timothy 4:12). Don't let your children look down on you.
The second thing you can do to influence your teens is to regularly for them and with
them. Pray for them to like Christ. Pray for them to the temptations they
face. Pray for them to find friends and pray for their friends. Let your teenagers know
that they are important in your heart to the point that you will pray for them
When you pray, ask God for wisdom to guide you in raising your son or daughter. Each child is
different and unique. What works with one may not work with another. You must love them all, but
to love them properly means you must them well and what they need. Since children go
through phases of life, you need to keep through each phase. A good way to keep track
of your children is to pray them about the most important matters of life.
The third thing you can do is to the main thing the main thing. Don't let the
distractions of life build a between your family and God. The Lord Jesus said, "Do not
worry then, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear for
clothing?' For the Gentiles eagerly seek all these things; for your heavenly Father knows that you
need all these things. But seek His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things
will be added to you" (Matthew 6:31-33).

words of this law. For it is not an idle word for you; indeed it is your life" (Deuteronomy 32:46-

they thought were Christians living sinful lives and think the whole church is full
of hypocrites. Still others get caught up in their own sins and simply drop out because they're
Others go to a college with professors who do not believe in Jesus Christ and
they believing themselves. Still others fall away because they're with
their parents, and they know quitting church will hurt them.

When children fall away, parents have to figure out what has the problem and
take steps to bring their children back. Sadly, people do as they and you can't make
them do what is right. That doesn't mean that you're, however. You can do
something to make a in your child's life. Scripture says, "But you, beloved, build
yourselves up in your most holy faith; pray in the Holy Spirit; keep yourselves in the of
God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to life. And have
mercy on those who doubt; save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show
with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh" (Jude 20-23).

teenagers or adults, I know you parents take the of your children seriously. You want
them to remain with God and to live with him forever. The best thing you can do for
your children is to remain in your faith. Live what you believe consistently; be
to the Lord and to His cause. When your faith is true and sincere, you will stay close
to God. You'll also your authentic faith to your sons and daughters. They will respect
you for being genuine in your faith.
Second, love them. Everyone love. Love doesn't mean that you condone or
their sins; it does mean that you won't give up on them. Loving them means letting
them know you for them in spite of the life that they're living and want what is best
for your children. While parents must stand firm against what's sinful, that doesn't mean they
can't love their child. Many young adults need to understand that love doesn't necessarily
mean of every behavior. God can love us as his children and yet our
sinful behavior. Jesus hated the sins that we all commit because he knew how destructive they
are to us; and He loved us all enough to go to the for us.
The Bible says, "For while we were still, at the right time Christ died for the
ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a person
one would dare even to die—but God shows his for us in that while we were still
sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8). Christ acted out of love to sinners. He
wanted them to be and was willing to bear the cross so that they could come out of
their sins.
Some people have the mistaken belief that Jesus' death on the cross allows them to find
, but without change or repentance; but this is not the case. When Jesus rescued and
forgave the woman caught in adultery, He said, "go, and from now on no more" (John
8:11). Young people have to the grace of God is not some license to stay in sin, but
expects us to our lives to conform to His will. Some young people think condemning
sin, as the Bible does, is mean-spirited, but nothing could be farther from the truth.
Read what the Scripture says in Titus 2:11-14. God does not save us to us
where He found us. He saves us to help us become people. God's way is to bless us
and not leave us in destructive, sinful lifestyles.

Third, you can for them. Some folks must go through times before they
see where their sins are leading them. Pray they'll come to their senses. Pray they'll remember

should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). He won't twist the arm of your son or daughter; but
God can use all kinds of circumstances to people up to their spiritual condition. Your
son or daughter has a conscience, and who knows what will that conscience and turn
their hearts. They still can their lives around.
Fourth, you can with them and encourage them to come back to God. The Bible
says, "Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should
him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be"
(Galatians 6:1). Parents, your attitude toward your young adults may be the real in
winning back their hearts. If you become self-righteous or get, you will certainly
end any meaningful communication. But if you gently and humbly approach them in love,
they may to you.

others to recognize theirs. The apostle Paul told Timothy, "The Lord's bond-servant must not
be quarrelsome, but be to all, able to teach, patient when wronged, with gentleness
correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to
the knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and from the snare
of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will" (2 Timothy 2:24-26). Parents, read
this passage, study it, and meditate upon it as you strive to be God's in reaching
out to your child.
