Doing the Father's will was not a concept or behavior to Jesus. From the time He was born,
He realized that He had into this world to do the Father's will. At age 12, Jesus was in the
Temple His Father's business. Later on, when the devil tempted Him at age 30, Jesus said, "Be
gone, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall the Lord your God and him only shall you serve'"
(Matthew 4:10
In John, chapter 4, Jesus passed through Samaria. Stopping at a near the town of Sychar,
Jesus sent his disciples into town for some while He rested. At the well Jesus had a remarkable
conversation with a woman who had been married five times and was living with a man. When she
learned Jesus was the Messiah, she into town and told all the men of the town and the disciples
returned with the food.
Then John 4:31-34 says: "Meanwhile the disciples were urging Him, saying, 'Rabbi,' But He
said to them, 'I have food to eat that you don't about.' So the disciples were saying to one another,
'No one Him anything to eat, did he?' And Jesus said to them, 'My food is to do the will of
Him who sent Me and to accomplish His"" The Lord Jesus to do the will of His Father
in heaven.
In John 5:30, Jesus explained, "I can do nothing on My initiative. As I , I judge; and
My judgment is just, because I do not My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me." Jesus
regarded the will of the Father as the standard of right and wrong. He didn't want to
from His Father's will in any way, so He listened to the Father. He made judgments of right and wrong
as the will of the Father instructed. He didn't on His own initiative.
In Jesus' heart and mind, keeping the will of the Father, was how He remained in a
relationship with His Father. The Lord said to His disciples on the night before He died, "Just as the
Father has loved Me, I have also loved you; in My love. If you My commandments,
you will abide in My love; just as I have My Father's commandments and abide in His love"
(John 15:9-10). Abiding in the Father's will was an of love and devotion. Keeping the Lord's
commandments is we demonstrate our love to the Lord and remain in His love.

On the other hand, Jesus finished the Sermon on the Mount with these words, "Not everyone who
says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who the will of My Father who
is in heaven will enter. Many will to Me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your
name, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?' And then I will
declare to them, 'I knew you; depart from me, you who practice lawlessness'" (Matthew 7:21-23).
The Lord knew people would to have a relationship with Him, while they lived lawlessly.
They wanted the blessing of Christianity but they didn't to the will of the Father in heaven.
The Lord Jesus never knew them. He never had a relationship with them. They never belonged to Him,
because they lived life on their lawless terms and would not the will of the Father. You
can't live by your own will and expect to the Lord.

You can't draw close to God while you turn your back on what the Father You obey God
by obeying what He teaches, not by you love Him while living the way that you desire. A
person who lives in lawlessness says to the Lord, "Not Your will be done but" He lives by his
own and ignores God's law. He hasn't set his on the Father's will but on pleasing himself.
A person who plays by his own will he is the exception. He thinks his sins aren't as
as other people's sins. He does as he and presumes the Lord will still consider that as
obedience. He counts on his own, not God's will, to assure him a place in heaven. The Lord's
rejection is going to him.
We should strive to the will of the Lord. It will not only bless us, it will bless
everyone around us. The Bible says, "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the
renewing of your, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and
acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2). Doing God's will shows everyone the of the Lord's
way! It is good and acceptable and perfect.
Jesus taught us to, "Thy will be done." Have you thought about how radically different and
better our world would be if people did the will of God? God's will for our lives is no small
matter. If people did God's will, crime would disappear, the moral climate of this country would
drastically change, and people would be more loving and less selfish. We'd the golden rule.
The Lord Jesus taught that "In everything, therefore, treat people the way you want them to
treat you, for this is the Law and the Prophets" (Matthew 7:12).
If we did God's will on earth, as it is in heaven, God's Word would have a place of in
our lives and decisions. We'd be asking the question, "What does God's Word have to about this
matter or that?" We'd realize that the God who created us knows us better than we know ourselves and
teaches us what is We'd make our life choices and think of right and wrong on the basis of
God's not our opinions or our culture.
If we did God's will on earth, we'd begin to pray as a people again. We'd realize that nothing
can happen without God's blessing and favor. We'd seek His face. What does that mean, "seek His face"?
It means we'd look to God for help and for the of life. When Solomon became king, he asked
God for to know how to lead the people of Israel. He worried about what might happen if
Israel the Lord and faced famine and were defeated in battle. Solomon asked God to be
willing to His people.
The Lord God answered Solomon's prayer with this found in 2 Chronicles 7:13-14, "If
My people who are called by My name themselves and pray and seek My face and turn
from their wicked ways, then I will from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land."
God wants to draw close to His people, when they pray to Him with humble hearts, turning from
wickedness, and then God will hear and heal them.
If God's will were truly done on earth, we'd stop God's name being taken in vain and in
filthy talk. Ephesians 4:29 says, "Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a
word as is for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those
who hear." Words are important; and our speech would be gracious, seasoned with salt, as we ought to
speak.
If God's will were done on earth, we'd set our hearts on things that rather than concentrate
on things that corrupt. The Bible says, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable,
whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any
excellence, if there's anything worthy of praise, about these things" (Philippians 4:8). What
we think about shapes our When our minds concentrate on the good, we see good all around

us; and we become people. The Bible says, "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company ruins good
morals" (1 Corinthians 15:33). When what is bad fills our minds, evil fills our lives.
If God's will were done on earth, we'd think more about the Lord and about The Bible

but of God" (John 1:11-13). You can't be saved by substituting some human for God's will. God
is God, and we are human. We can't edit or overrule the will of God. If we are saved by God's,
it will only be by His will. To know His will we read and study the New Testament.
What does God will for us to do to be? Upon hearing the gospel of Jesus, we must

us to Jesus Christ, providing testimony from witnesses of His death, burial, and

Read how Hugo McCord explained the concept of inspiration.
Our reading today comes from 2 Peter 1:16-21. Peter is describing how prophetic
utterances, the Scriptures, came about through inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

"Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light" (Genesis 1:3). God spoke
into existence. Psalm 33:6 says, "By the word of the LORD the heavens were, And by

The Words of Jesus are likewise powerful and authoritative. Colossians 1:16-17 reminds us,

And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together." When Jesus spoke,

Peter explains, "For if God did not angels when they sinned, but cast them into
hell and committed them to pits of darkness, reserved for judgment; and did not spare the
ancient world, but preserved Noah, a preacher of righteousness, with seven others, when He
brought a flood upon the world of the ungodly; and if He condemned the cities of Sodom and
Gomorrah to destruction by reducing them to ashes, having made them an example to those
who would live ungodly lives thereafter; and if He rescued righteous Lot, oppressed by the
sensual conduct of unprincipled men (for by what he saw and heard that righteous man, while
living among them, felt his righteous soul tormented day after day by their lawless deeds), then
the Lord knows how to the godly from temptation, and to keep the unrighteous
under punishment for the day of judgment" (2 Peter 2:4-9). Since the Lord has a record of how

No one else has died for our sins, and no one else could. He showed us the love of God and we should love God. First Peter 3:18 says, "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might us to God." Our sins separated us from God, but the love of Christ opened the door for us to be with God, so that we could live with Him forever.
Though we were once in sin, He lovingly and sacrificially made it possible for us to be at with God through the blood of the cross. Colossians 1:21-22 describes what He did: "And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his

others. If you call yourself a Christian and then act like you never knew Christ, you need to examine yourself and

When Jesus appears, will see Him. Revelation 1:7 says, "Behold, he's coming with the clouds, and every will see him, even those who pierced him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of him. Even so. Amen." And then we who are and remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds to the Lord in the air, so we shall always be with the Lord." Yes, we'll the voice and the trumpet of God. Each of these will call our attention to what is happening. Did you notice that we will be caught up into the to meet the Lord? The Lord Jesus won't set on the earth. Instead, He'll be in the clouds; and we will meet Him there. When He comes again, we have to this earth for a very good reason.
We do need to know, however, that this audible of His appearance will come suddenly and unexpectedly. The Scriptures teach that the Lord's coming will be "like a in the night" (1 Thessalonians 5:2 and we simply don't know when Jesus will come again; we know that He will come but not (2 Peter 3:10). God has not revealed the Deuteronomy 29:29 says, "The secret things belong to the LORD our God, but the things that are belong to us and to our children forever." The Lord Jesus Himself reveals that the day of His second coming at the end of the world is a Only the knows when He will come again.
The Lord said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my will not pass away. But concerning that day and hour knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. For as were the of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (Matthew 24:35-39). Sadly, some today what the Lord said and imagine they know exactly when this second coming will happen. They imagine they know than Jesus. Many have predicted a time and deceived others in the matter; and when the time passes unchanged, they show themselves to be prophets, they simply don't know.
Many people apply things found in Matthew 24 to the second coming. People frequently speak of things that actually to the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD, and that includes the destruction of the temple. The passage, Matthew 24, clearly speaks of what is to happen Jerusalem and Jerusalem, and not what's to happen worldwide. Jesus prior to verse 35 reveals numerous things to happen to people that were alive at that time and the need to Jerusalem. On the other hand verse 36, speaking of the destruction of the heavens and earth begins with the word "but," and is followed by an uncertainty of time. The destruction of Jerusalem is the destruction of the world.
Three things will happen when Jesus comes again. First, Jesus will resurrect every person, good or evil, from the John 5:28-29 says, "Do not marvel at this, for an hour is coming when who are in the tombs will hear his voice and come out, those who have done to the resurrection of

life, and those who have done to the resurrection of judgment." The resurrection mattered to Paul, and he spoke of its importance before the governor Felix. He said, "But this I admit to you, that according to the Way which they (that is, the Jews) call a sect I do the God of our fathers, believing everything that is in accordance with the Law and that is written in the Prophets; having a hope in God, which these men (that is, the Pharisees) cherish themselves, that there shall certainly be a resurrection of the righteous and the wicked. In view of this, I also do my to maintain always a blameless conscience both before God and before men" (Acts 24:14-16). Paul wanted to be right with God at the resurrection.
Death is the separation of the body from the spirit (James 2:26), but resurrection is when the Lord will the dead, after which He will give them a new body. First Corinthians 15:50-52 explains, "I tell you this, brothers: flesh and blood cannot inherit the of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. Behold! Second, when Jesus comes again, the earth and its works will be up. We will leave this earth, because God has decided to it. Second Peter 3:7 says, "But by the same word the heavens and earth that now exist are stored up for, being kept until the day of judgment and destruction of the ungodly." Again in verse 12 Peter notes, "the heavens will be destroyed by burning, and the elements will with intense heat!" As we noted from 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9, Jesus will come in flaming fire, taking vengeance on those that do not know God and those who do not the gospel. Revelation 21:1 speaks of John's vision, "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had away, and the sea was no more." All that we know of the present heaven and earth will have vanished, destroyed by fire and intense heat.
Third, when Jesus comes again, He will make a final on all people, the good and the bad. Second Corinthians 5:10 says, "For we must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his in the body, according to what he's done, whether good or bad." The Lord Jesus Himself taught, "When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He'll sit on His glorious And all the nations will be gathered before Him; and He will them from one another, as the shepherd separates the sheep from the goats; and He'll put the sheep on His right, and the goats on His left" (Matthew 25:31-32). In verse 46 he clearly shows their destiny: "These (goats who failed to serve the Lord) will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
The Lord Jesus proclaimed, "He who Me and does not receive My sayings, has one who judges him; the I spoke is what will judge him at the last day" (John 12:48). You and I won't be judged by our culture, by the creeds of men, or by human traditions. We will be judged by the words of Jesus found in the New Testament. Some think the words of Jesus only appear in letters, but we can consider the words of the New Testament as God's teaching. Paul said, "If anyone thinks he's a prophet or spiritual, let him recognize that the things which I to you are the Lord's commandment" (1 Corinthians 14:37). The written word will be found at the Judgment. Revelation 20:12 says, "And I saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne, and books were opened; and another book was opened, which is the book of life; and the dead were from the things which were written in the books, according to their deeds."

If our final destiny will be decided at the second coming, shouldn't we get for that day?
Shouldn't we think about the destruction of the world and of our destiny? Second Peter 3:11
says, "Since all these things are to be destroyed in this way, what sort of people ought you to be in
conduct and godliness?" Do you look forward to the coming of Jesus or would you mourn at his coming?
Revelation 1:7 says, "Behold, He is coming with the clouds, and eye will see Him, even those

The Lord Jesus said, "For whoever is ashamed of Me and My, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when He comes in His glory, and the glory of the Father and of the holy angels" (Luke 9:26). If we wish to the kingdom of heaven we cannot be ashamed of Him or of His words. We must love Him, obey Him, and abide in Him.
There is a difference between being "" Christ and "out of" Christ. Many people have rejected or believing in Christ Jesus. Others have bought into a gospel and failed to follow the Scriptures. Such people will be on judgment day when they won't be allowed to enter heaven. The wise hear the words of Jesus and them; the foolish hear the words of Jesus but to do them.
